Ducklings

The children have also enjoyed finding out about different mini beasts and have used books and the internet to help them find the answers to their questions. The children have also been exploring the musical instruments and I have enjoyed listening to the different tunes they have composed and watching the different dances which have been choreographed. Music is such a wonderful way for the children to develop the skills that they need to help them learn to read. The children have been particularly imaginative this week and have used a variety of materials to construct some wonderful models. I have been impressed with their problem solving skills and adventures that they have created.

We have been very busy enjoying the lovely sunshine and planting our vegetable garden. The children were really surprised to find out what the different seeds and bulbs look like before the plants grow. We are growing potatoes, tomatoes, runner beans, chillies, cucumbers and courgettes. The children have been caring for the plants and are remembering to water them every day. In maths we have been learning to count and recognise our numbers to 20 and have been playing bingo and snakes and ladders to help us count and remember what the number looks like as an amount. In English, we have been pretending to be different characters from Supertato. The children have been asking questions to the characters to find out why they behaved in certain ways and how they were feeling. We were extremely impressed with the questions and answers that the children thought of. Thank you so much to those parents for sending in photographs of your children at different ages and a photograph of the outside of your house. 
Badger

Last week Badgers continued to work on their story writing based on the book 'Lost and Found' and have created their own innovated stories using their own choice of characters and settings. The children have worked really hard on their writing and it is pleasing to see that they are using their phonics accurately to spell unfamiliar words. However, there is still some work to do on using full stops and capital letters correctly to demarcate sentences. This week we have started our new English unit 'Hansel and Gretel', we have read the story and then sequenced key parts using pictures. The children have helped to prepare the English display in the classroom by designing and colouring their own gingerbread houses. In PE this week we have been focusing on developing our balance and co-ordination by practicing throwing and catching balls. Next week we will be progressing with this by using tennis rackets and balls in order to challenge our skills in the hope that we will be able to apply these skills to focused games. At play times this week we have been enjoying playing with toys. Miss Snape has put out some boxes of toys, as well as setting up the sand pit and water tray for us to use. We are also now working on earning an extra reward at the end of the day by earning counters for good listening, hard work and good behaviour.



Hedgehog

The children have had another great fortnight of learning in Hedgehog class. This week the children have been completing their non-chronological report about their made-up safari animals. We have had all sorts of creations and I have been blown away with the children's creativity and imagination regarding this. In maths, we have finished up our unit on length and height and will be starting position and direction from Tuesday. The children have risen to the challenge of answering more reasoning and problem solving questions and have become more confident in answering two step questions. In science, we have implemented an investigation into what plants need in order to grow. We have placed some seeds in pots and have predicted which pot we think will grow the best: sun and water/sun and no water/ water and no sun/ no sun or water. Maybe you could have a go at home too?

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
Rabbit

We have worked hard this week to develop our understanding of decimals. We have been using place value grids to help us to solve decimal problems. In topic, we explore the causes of earthquakes, modelling the tectonic plates and mantle with crackers and squirty cream! We were amazed to find out that 45 earthquakes had happened around the world on the day of our lesson - we found this out by using a website that tracks earthquakes around the world. In literacy, we have continued to explore the story of *Hatchet*, hot seating the main character and using several sentence games to help us imitate the style of the author. Madame Reynolds taught us how to say the days of the week in French - we were able to state a given day, date and month. Miss Blount has worked with us this week - we are looking forward to working with her over the next six weeks!




Mole

We did a hot seating activity using these characters, which was fabulous as the children had become very involved in this exciting poem. They then wrote in the role of these characters and produced some excellent work. I am delighted that so many children are now fully engaged in their learning and enjoying the activities covered.

During the last two weeks the children have enjoyed their new topic on World War 2. This week they have been learning about rationing and how families had to manage on limited supplies of food. In maths, we have been working on being able to plot coordinates in all 4 quadrants and solve related problems. In art, they have been developing their origami skills and have learnt that they need to be very precise with their folding! In science over the last two weeks, the children have been continuing their topic about light and learning how the eye works. Today they have been developing their investigation skills with a focus on shadows.
