Happy New Year.

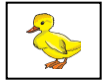
I hope that you all had a lovely Christmas and New Year.

It is good to be back at school, and Badgers have had a busy week getting back to work! This week we have started new units for all subjects. In English, we are looking at the picture book 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jefferson. We will be using this story to write our own versions at the end of the unit.

In maths, we have been learning how to tell the time using o'clock and half past. The children have enjoyed using model clocks to make given times and have then used this to solve one step word problems. Next week we will be moving onto recording time and understanding time related vocabulary.

This half term in science we are learning about seeds and plants. We have planted some different types of seeds and will observe the changes over the next few weeks. A morning check on the plants seems to be a popular thing for the children to do at the moment!



Hedgehog

Happy New Year and welcome back. Hedgehog have come back into school full of enthusiasm and positive attitudes towards their learning and have worked exceptionally hard this week. We started the week by revising some of the maths that was taught last term and then moved on to continuing our multiplication and division unit. This week the children have been looking at pictorial representations of groups and working out how to turn this into a multiplication sentence (3 equal groups of 5 is 15 / $3 \times 5 = 15$). In English, we have started a new unit about diary entries. The children imagined they were back in the evening of Christmas day, writing all about the excitement.

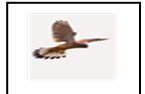
Hare

As part of our new Literacy topic, we thought about the features of a newspaper report before having a go at writing one ourselves. In Art, we identified the features of a desert environment before creating a mood board to help inspire us when creating our own desert landscapes. In PE, we investigated ways that we could incorporate different types of jumps into a gymnastics routine. After, we performed our routines to the rest of the class. First of all Happy New Year. Having recharged their batteries over the holiday, the children have produced some great work during the first week. We are continuing to enjoy the Michael Morpurgo novel that we have nearly finished. They have used their senses to empathise with how a character was feeling to produce their written work this week. In Maths, the children have spent a week on data handling so they should now be able to work out the mean, median, mode and range and next week we will continue with this by learning to construct, as well as interpret, graphs. Our topic work is interesting, as we have just started a topic on rivers which is a collaborative project we are working on along with a partner school in Alderney.

This week it has been lovely to hear about what the children did over the Christmas and New Year holiday, and they have all come back refreshed and ready to learn. In Maths the class have been learning about fractions and decimals and in English writing a persuasive letter to Currys PC World about the new Apple Ipad Pro. Some of the children took part in the STEM Challenge at Lacon Childe School and thoroughly enjoyed designing and building a stadium.
