The attention to detail and perseverance that was demonstrated was wonderful to see. We have had a lovely fortnight in Fox Class and the children have been enjoying a wide range of activities both inside and outside the classroom. The children have really enjoyed learning and retelling "The Gruffalo". They have been busy putting the story in the correct order, saying sentences to describe how the animals move and making Gruffalo crumble. The children have learnt and can already use some wonderful vocabulary that Grandpa Fantastic has taught them. It was wonderful to see them making their Gruffalo crumble mud pies. The delight in their faces was wonderful to see as their muddy mixture oozed through their fingers. Their crumbles also smelt delicious with the mixture of herbs they included. In maths, the children have been busy counting to 5 and have spent time to ensure that they understand the value of each digit and can form each digit correctly. They have also been exploring all the different ways there are to make 5 and it is wonderful to see them becoming more confident to recall these related facts. The children have also been exploring colour and they have enjoyed discovering what happened when they mixed different combinations of primary colours together. We were impressed with their observation skills and this activity generated some wonderful discussions.

Badgers have had a busy week this week! We have enjoyed our PE lessons, which were yoga and dance. In our yoga lesson we were focusing on posture and breathing techniques whilst stretching. This is very good for developing core muscles, as well as relaxation techniques. In dance this week we have been practising our routine in preparation for our class finale next week. With any lock we will be able to record the performance and opload it to the website so that parents can see what we have been up to.

In science this week we have been learning about the position of the sun in the sky throughout the day and we were lucky enough to have a clear sky to be able to make our observations. Next week we will be looking at weather and how this coinsides with the seasons. Lockily, we have managed to dodge the bad weather this week and still enjoy our play times! The children have also been busy learning their new phonics sounds alongside tricky words, which we are then

identifying in our reading books. It is pleasing to see that the children are remembering the new sounds and able to refer to them at the beginning of each phonics session. It would be great if the children could identify these sounds whilst reading at home too.



Hedgehog

This fortnight in maths, Hedgehog class have finished their unit on place value and have moved on to addition and subtraction. This week we have been looking at fact families using part-whole models and bar models. The children are very good at finding all four addition facts but are finding the subtraction facts a little trickier. We will continue working on this next week to embed the learning. In English, the children have completed their own suspense story after learning all about them in our talk 4 writing unit. I was very impressed with their hard work and some fantastic vocabulary was used. We have now moved on to learning about persuasive writing. I was also impressed with their writing where they had to attempt to persuade me to give the class extra break. In PE we are continuing to learn about ball control in varies ways. This week's focus has been rolling a ball with the

correct amount of force to aim for a horizontal target. In music we are enjoying the movement of finding the pulse to varies pieces of music. Another wonderful and hardworking fortnight. Well done, Hedgehogs!

We have worked hard this week to develop our understanding of rounding. Rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 has helped us to estimate answers. In PE, we have continued to explore the skills necessary to complete an orienteering course. This week, we thought about how teamwork could help us to achieve our goal and we used a much more detailed map.

In French, we learnt how to say the phrase 'my birthday is on ...' with Mrs Reynolds. We have learnt so many new and interesting French phrases with her over the past few weeks. We are even having a go at writing in French! Our vocabulary ninjas continue to expand their vocabulary, collecting interesting words and phrases that we have come across in our writing and reading. Elsewhere, the children have been learning about the circulatory system in science and have been developing their painting skills in art. Many children have now read their first book of the year and have updated their reading records. It is great to see that there are nany children who are keen to read and have made it part of their daily routine.
