We stopped and had a look at the twisted spire before continuing up the high street and down Pinkham Lane to the old water mill. There we had a look at the outside of the mill and talked about what is was used for before walking back to school. The children really enjoyed the walk and luckily the weather stayed dry. We were also lucky enough to see a slow worm and a donkey on our travels!

This week we have continued with our work on locality week and have sketched some of the buildings we saw from photographs that we took. We focused on using tone and shading to give the buildings a 3D effect. We have also looked at the school grounds and landmarks in KS1 and KS2 before drawing our own small scale maps with a key. This has been a lovely end to this half term and we are all looking forward to starting new topics after the half term.

This fortnight the children have worked wonderfully hard across all areas of the curriculum. In English, we are using an extract from Fantastic Mr Fox to embed our learning of inverted commas. The children have been very creative with this and we have used macaroni to help us remember to open and close our speech. In Maths, we have finished

our unit on position and direction, and we have been using the last fortnight to consolidate some of the skills we have learnt this year. We have been revising how to use place value charts in addition and subtraction and explain how and when we need to exchange. This week across the school, we have been celebrating 'Locality Week'. We have been learning all about the local history and the geographical location of Cleobury Mortimer. The children fully enjoyed a walk down to the old Mill and enjoyed observing and talking about the historical buildings we have on the high street. The children exceeded my expectations and were very polite to local residents who stopped to let us through and acted very responsibly next to the main road. When we arrived back at school, we viewed the photos we took and drew some pictures of the buildings we saw, being very careful to look at and include all the details.
