Class News

Ducklings

In our last few weeks of our Autumn half term the children have been looking at the celebration of harvest. We have looked at how food is harvested and through to how it arrives in our houses. The children dug up carrots and pumpkins and have enjoyed using them in a variety of ways all week. We have decorated them and used them in our home area kitchen, we have looked at how the pumpkins roll and the ways in which we can transport them around the classroom and finally what they look like when we cut them up. We have finished our work with the Three Little Pigs, retelling the story and imitating our own versions. There have been some excellently acted retellings, so please ask your child about this (especially the Big Bad Wolf). We have been representing the number three in different ways including playing games where the children gathered three items, sometimes animals, sometimes items of different colours. Our phonics games have really come along in the last few weeks, the children have been very good at "passing the code" and making new codes for each other to try. The children have also made minions and rockets to take home, using their painting and crafting skills that we hope they will be able to show you at home over the half term. These last few days we have begun on our Autumn wreaths, copying and mixing colours themselves matching the leaves on the trees. We have also updated our seasons tree so that it closely resembles the tree outside of our window. Our final activities of the half term will be making our Halloween monsters that the children can use as decorations at home. Fox

During the last two weeks in Fox Class, we have continued reading The Gruffalo story, we have been practising changing our voices for the different characters, choosing our favourite characters, and choosing a new animal for the story. In maths we have been writing our numbers to 5, representing 5 in different ways and getting quicker at remembering our number bonds to 5. In topic we have been talking about caring for our teeth, we practised cleaning the plastic teeth and we have been learning a song to help us to clean our own teeth. We were very lucky to be able to go and plant some flower bulbs at the Skate Park and we are looking forward to seeing them grow and flower next Spring. During our work on Harvest we investigated root vegetables and talked about how important farmers are, we made some harvest wreaths. Squirrel

Squirrels have been very busy over the last two weeks, but have had lots of fun enjoying different activities, including bulb planting! Last week we were lucky enough to walk over to the skate park and plant some crocus bulbs, ready to grow in the spring. The children learnt about which way up the bulbs needed to be planted in order for them to grow. We are excited to see what happens in the spring time and hopefully we will see a blue patch of crocus flowers growing!

We have continued to focus on counting to 5 and identifying number bonds to 5 in maths using a range of practical equipment. Miss North and Mrs Dews have also been working with us to help us form our number correctly. After half term we will recap numbers to 5 before moving onto learning numbers to 10.

We have also covered Harvest through discussion and exploring different root vegetables and pumpkins, which was great fun. The children are working hard on learning about the surrounding environment. We hope that you all have a great half term and look forward to seeing you after.

Badger

In Badger Class we have been concentrating on addition and equals signs in Maths. We have also been working on our number bonds to 5 and adding to 10 using two numbers. In English, we have finished our class book Percy the Park Keeper 'After the storm'. We have thoroughly enjoyed reading this story this half term. We have thought about nouns and adjectives that we can hear throughout the text. We really enjoyed designing our own front cover for this story. We have also been learning the rhyme 'Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear' and this week we created our own version. In phonics we have been learning the 'ee' and 'oi' digraphs, please continue to practise these at home over half term. During our afternoons, we have been thinking about Autumn and our environment. We have been creating and colouring Autumn pictures. This was lots of fun. Have a happy half term.

The children have been working extremely hard and are ready for a well deserved rest.

In English, the children were surprised to find a saucepan, knife, peeler, chopping board and pumpkin in the classroom. They used their detective skills to work out what our new story was, Pumpkin Soup by Helen Cooper. I was impressed with their predictions and the reasons that they gave to support their ideas. The children have also been identifying new vocabulary and found many different words to describe how the characters were feeling.

In maths, we have been counting in different steps and the children are becoming confident to count in 2's. They have also been doing lots of problem solving which has challenged their understanding of number.

I have been really impressed with the quality of the projects that the children have produced at home. It has been great to see the information presented in such a variety of ways and the children are becoming more confident to speak in front of the class.

In science, the children had a wonderful day making the bug hotel. It was great to see them working together and using a range of problem solving skills to ensure that the hotel was built to their satisfaction.
