Ducklings

It has been lovely to see the children again and hear their wonderful stories of their Easter holidays. We have continued our work with plants and have planted some beautiful flowers around norsery and on the playground. In maths the children have been doing lots of work with the numbers of how old they are. We have been singing songs and looking at lots of fun ways to represent their number. In phonics it has been lovely to hear all the songs they have been singing at home and they have sung them for us in circle time. The children have been making some bunting and some amazing animals to decorate our outside area, which is has now been visually improved. All the children have come back really well and we all look forward to having a super summer term.

Fox

We have had an excellent start to our new term. We have begun our new topic 'All Creatures Great and Small, we began by looking for minibeasts in the outdoor classroom and then we watched a PowerPoint presentation that helped us identify different minibeasts and recognise their habitats. We then made our own Life Cycle of a Butterfly using a paper plate and pasta!

In literacy we have been reading 'The Hungry Caterpillar' we have investigated the different fruits and vegetables that were in the story, we have made caterpillars and butterflies and we have written sentences about what we remembered from the story.

In phonics we are recapping our Phase 3 sounds and our tricky words.

In maths we have been learning to recognise and write our numbers to 20, the activities we have been doing have been making us think about how many tens and ones we need for each number. In PE we are beginning to practise for Sports Day.

Squirrel

We have had a great start to the new term. We have started our new topic 'All Creatures Great and Small' which we are really enjoying! So far we have looked at different minibeast and have enjoyed exploring our role play area, where we have a range of minibeasts and some nature viewers to look at them in more detail. We have also looked at the life cycle of a butterfly and have completed our own lifecycles using paper plates and pasta. Our topic is linking to our English text 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and in English this week we have used our phase 2 and 3 phonics to write a sentence from the story. Miss Snape is very impressed with our sounding out and spelling!

In maths we have started to count to 20 and represent numbers using practical equipment. We have looked at how we can use tens and ones to compose given numbers. Next week we will continue working on this.

The year one children have been working on investigating measuring height and length- for this we have gathered different sized sticks and compared them before putting them into order. We have also looked at the heights of children in our group and put them into order too.

The children have settled into to school well and have worked extremely hard after their holiday.

In English, we have started our new unit which is based on "The Giraffe, The Pelly and Me" by Roald Dahl and we have been learning lots of new vocabulary. We have also been identifying parts of the story that we found unusual or had questions about. We have many questions that we would like to the characters or the author.

In maths, we have been looking at fractions and the children have been halving and quartering shapes and numbers. I have been impressed with their ability to count forwards and backwards in halves. Today, we managed to count to 40 1/2 and only stopped because we ran out of time.

In science, we have been looking at what makes a balanced diet and how to stay healthy. We used flour and water to show how easily germs are passed between people and realised how important it is to dry our hands too. We discovered that germs love the warm, wet places in between our fingers.

In art, we have been creating printing tiles based on African patterns. We had to concentrate hard to create our printing tile but loved how easy it was to print on paper and fabric. We are looking forward to completing our African wall hanging.

In topic, we have been finding out about the different animals that live in Africa and positioned them on a map so that the habitat provided them with all the food, water and shelter they needed. We also described their location using compass points.
