In Fox class we have been learning lots of new sounds and tricky words in phonics with Geraldine giraffe. In the outdoor classroom we enjoyed having some fun exploring time and going on the rope assault course. In Literacy we have been continuing our work on Goldilocks and the Three Bears and learning the word 'the' and 'no'. In Maths we have been learning to write our numerals correctly and understanding the value of 1 to 10.



### Badger

Firstly, it was great to meet and catch up with so many parents last week at parents evening. It has been a pleasure to share and celebrate all of the children's progress with you. This week has been a busy week with story writing. The children are writing the story of 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' and are using all of the spelling and grammar skills that we have been looking at over this last half term.

The children are making great progress with their writing and next week we will be adjusting the story to make it our own, before writing a final version. In maths, we have been focusing on adding and subtracting within 20 and working on solving word problems, which the children have enjoyed but also found a challenge.

It is now full steam ahead with Christmas performance rehearsals!



### Hedgehog

Hedgehog's have had another busy fortnight with their learning. In maths, the children have completed their unit on addition and subtraction and have moved forwards into money. Over this fortnight, the children have been learning to count in pounds and pence and have been investigating how to make up a certain amount in different ways. Over the next couple of weeks, we will be looking comparing money and how to find change. In English, the children have finished their own stories based on our text, 'The Hedgehog' by Dick King Smith. Hedgehogs have used some wonderful vocabulary that they have learnt and have really impressed me with their descriptions and interesting verbs. In Topic, we have began learning about Mary Seacole and over the course of the next few weeks, will begin to compare her life to that of Florence Nightingale.

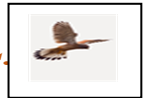
## Hare
